Director of Public Health Update - Sal Nesci

Council Liaison Update – Paula Luna

Councilwoman Luna provided the following updates.

Senior/Human Services Director's Report – Amy Saada (report attached)

Amy advised the commission that the Department of Transportation Grant application submission process has started and that if awarded, funds would be used towards a new van. She also added that the van awarded by previous year's grant is due to be received by the Senior Center mid-March, 2024.

Old Business

A. Senior Center ARPA Funding Project Space Needs

Amy reported that the Senior Center had received its first of three cabinetry quotes from Martin Cabinets, the quote is approximately \$32,000. She added that there are plans to move the pool tables into expanded Senior Center space on Monday, March 18.

New Business

A. National Nutrition Month

Amy shared that March is National Nutrition Month. She reported that the Senior Center is fundraising to support Meals on Wheels throughout the month. Anyone interested may make charitable donations starting at \$1, and their names may be displayed in the hallway outside of the Senior Center.

B. New Program/Partnership- Senior Open Swim at Champions Skating Rink

Amy reported that Cromwell Recreation Director, Scott Kieras, has been in communication with Champions Skating Rink management, they are offering a free introductory open swim event for members of the Cromwell Senior Center on April 3, from 2:00 pm - 3:00 pm. Amy added that the Senior Center will provide van transportation to those who need it. She also explained if there is interest, the Senior Center could offer a regularly scheduled swim time that would include an on duty lifeguard. She advised that individual cost would be dependent on the interest as there is a cost to using the pool.

Citizen's Comments

Diane advised the commission that she is a former member of the Central Connecticut Women's Club (CCWC). She added that she is still in communication with the club and could act as a liaison for the Senior Commission, if needed.

Judy Norris asked where the Cromwell Lions Club eyeglass donation bin is located in Cromwell town Hall. Amy advised that the box is located inside the entrance to the Senior Center.

Judy Benvenuto suggested the Senior Center provide a class on bullying for adults.

Anne Kaiser suggested the Senior Center have a presentation on medication safety. Amy advised that the town would soon be hiring a Prevention Specialist and that medication safety information would fall under programs they could facilitate. Amy added that she is working out a solution for the lack of space for her staff and programming.

Judy Norris suggested that the town utilize trailers as a solution to their lack of office and program space. A discussion was had about possible space saving solutions, including town employees working remotely.
