

A major, \$93,487,320, overhaul of the Mattabassett District Wastewater Treatment Facility to remove nitrogen from the wastewater it treats and sends into the Connecticut River to meet federal and state environmental regulations, and increase the treatment capacity of the facility , from its current 20 million gallons per day to 35 million gallons per day, to accommodate all of Middletown's water flow as well as wastewater from other communities, is scheduled to start this summer.

The project will be funded through Connecticut's Department of Energy and Environmental Protection's Clean Water Fund. This includes a Grant for 22.9 percent of the project's cost and a 20 year 2% loan for the balance. Each of the served towns — Cromwell, New Britain, Berlin, Middletown and MDC will pay their proportional share based on average flow to the facility.
