## Resolution in Support of Right To Counsel Legislation on the Basis of Counteracting LGBTQ+ Discrimination

Whereas: In a 2018 survey, 73 percent of LGBT Americans said they were strongly concerned about housing discrimination from agents, landlords, and neighbors<sup>1</sup>;

Whereas: According to data published by FreddieMac, trans and gender non conforming individuals had nearly half the likelyhood to own their home in comparison to the general population, this number also being true for lgbt people of color<sup>2</sup>;

Whereas: One paper commissioned by HUD reported that even states with have antidiscrimination laws such as Connecitcut, straight couples were still 16 percent more likely to be treated favoribly than gay male couples and 15.9 percent more likely to be treated faboribly than lesbian couples when it came to finding housing<sup>3</sup>;

Whereas: Nearly 2 in 10 trans and non gender conforming people have been homeless at some point in their lives, and those same 2 in 10 were 2.5 times more likely to have been incarcerated<sup>4</sup>;

Whereas: Nearly 2 in 10 trans and non gender conforming people have been denied housing because of their gender identity and a little over 1 in 10 has been evicted due to being trans or gender non conforming<sup>4</sup>;

Whereas: According to another paper published by Harvard University, landlords will not rent to those who have been evicted, further worsening the situation of evicted tenants<sup>5</sup>; and

Whereas: Other literature has prescribed that one way to limit the power of discriminatory landlords to evict tenants would be to "minimiz[e] landlord discretion at the outset" which would "give them fewer opportunities to exercise that discretion in a discriminatory manner"<sup>6</sup>;

Therefore Be It Resolved: That the Cromwell LGBT Committee urges the Connecticut General Assembly to pass legislation to—

- Establish access to an attorney as a right in eviction cases,
- Guarantee legal representation by not-for-profit legal service providers with expertise in housing law,
- Universally cover all residential tenants in all types of rental housing,
- Cover all evictions and all eviction-related cases, including administrative hearings,
- Fund for attorney training and support,
- Fund for tenant organizing, advocacy, and leadership development, and
- Establish affirmative litigation to enforce tenant rights.
