

Cromwell Animal Control Adoption Policy

- Potential adopters must fill out and submit BOTH an Adoption Application, and a signed Adoption Policy to be considered for adopting a pet.
- All household members must come in at the same time to meet the animal.
- Kittens are not available for adoption until they are 8 weeks of age and a minimum of 2 pounds.
- You must provide us with up to date vaccination records for your current pet(s) (as required under CTGS 22-339b). If your current pets are not vaccinated or spayed / neutered your application may be denied.
- If you own a dog you must provide a copy of the dog's current town dog license (as required under CTGS 22-339).
- If you have a dog and want to adopt a dog you must bring your current dog in for a meet and greet.
- Renters must show a lease or a notarized letter from their landlord/association stating they are allowed to own a pet and any restrictions on breed, size or number of pets allowed.
- You must contact your veterinarian and give permission to release medical information to Animal Control. Failure to do so may delay your application.
- Animals that are not spayed or neutered are adopted through the Animal Population Control Program (APCP) CTGS22-380f. The fee for any eligible un altered animal is \$50.00. (\$45.00/program and \$5.00/municipal). The APCP voucher benefits are as follows: \$80.00 for a male cat, \$120.00 for a female cat, \$180.00 for a male dog and \$200.00 for a female dog. In addition, the voucher will provide for two coincident pre-surgical vaccinations. Only Connecticut residents listed on voucher are eligible for benefits. Vouchers expire sixty days from adoption. Vouchers are not transferable. All other vet fees above voucher credit are the responsibility of the animal owner.
- Animals are not held while you are gathering the required documentation to have your application approved.
- In the case of multiple applications for the same animal, the animal will be adopted at the Animal Control Officers discretions. Prospective Adoptions are approved at the discretion of the Animal Control Officers.
- Every effort is made by Animal Control to match animals to proper homes and filling out an application does not guarantee that the prospective adopter will be approved for said animal.
- Cromwell Animal Control utmost goal is to match the right pet with the right forever home.
