

Without You There Is No us by Suki Kim Thursday, Oct. 25th - 6:30 p.m.

Every day, three times a day, the students march in two straight lines, singing praises to Kim Jong-il and North Korea: "Without you, there is no motherland. Without you, there is no us." It is a chilling scene, but gradually Suki Kim, too, learns the tune and, without noticing, begins to hum it. This is a haunting memoir of one woman's experiences going undercover as a missionary and a teacher in North Korea during 2011.

### This Month's Most Anticipated "Books You've Never Heard Of"

**Bitter Orange** by Claire Fuller -" a seductive psychological portrait" set during a British summer in the '60s and told through the eyes of one attic renter as she follows the lives of her landlords through a crack in her floorboards.

The Escape Artists by Neal Bascomb - The true story "brims with adventure, suspense, daring, and heroism" as Bascomb tells the story of the downed Allied airmen who masterminded the courageous breakout from Germany's most devilish POW camp. The Mermaid & Mrs. Hancock by Imogen Gowar - In 1780s London, a prosperous merchant finds his quiet life upended when he unexpectedly receives a most unusual creature—and meets a most extraordinary woman—in this lauded, atmospheric debut. Street Freaks by Terry Brooks - Brooks jumps easily from fantasy into gritty cyber punk, with his characteristic flair for storytelling. Washington Black by Esi Edugyan - A dazzling new novel, of self-invention and betrayal, of love and redemption, about a boy who rises from the ashes of slavery to become a free man of the world.
