Mayor Faienza called the meeting to order at 7 p.m.

F. CITIZEN COMMENTS (*Rules at the end of the agenda)

1. A. Kelly, Willowbrook Road and Chairman of the CWPCA and P&Z -Ms. Kelly spoke about the need for improved technology in Room 224/5, the misinformation in the Chronicle regarding putting a Sewerage Treatment Plant in Pierson Park and her opinion of item N.1

G. MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Faienza reported:

 Responded to Ms. Kelly's comments; He and Town Manager Sistare are looking into options to update the technology in room 224/5.

- He and Town Manager Sistare contacted both the Editor and the Chronicle writer about the article and asked for a correction in the next edition. The article was completely false and alarmed many Cromwell residents.
- The Search Subcommittee for a Town Manager has met twice. They decided to go with MRI (the firm that was used to hire the present Town Manager) since they know the lay of the land and they offered their services free. The Committee made several changes to the search criteria such as; concentrating on in-state applicants, the search committee will see all Connecticut applications, the background check will be done by the Cromwell Police, applications may be sent directly to the Mayor, the ad includes that Cromwell has a AAA bond rating, the essay questions were revised and the candidates profile was tweaked. After MRI vets the applicants the number will be reduced and the remaining candidates will be asked to answer the essay questions. When the essay round is complete the numbers will be reduced and brought before the entire Town Council who will at time become the Search Committee.
- Mayor Faienza advised that he will call a Special Meeting at the end of the month to act upon naming the Acting Town Manager. It is expected that the Acting Town Manager will start on February 2nd.
- Mayor Faienza congratulated Al Waters on behalf of the Council for receiving the honor of being named the Knights of Columbus Man of the Year for 2014. The Knights will hold a reception on the 30th at 2 p.m. in the Town Hall Lobby and also a program in the evening at their hall on Main Street. (Mr. Waters advised that the tickets are sold out). The public is invited to attend the Town Hall Program.

H. TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

Town Manager Sistare reported:

- A meeting was held with Jack Hanley from ESCO, our Streetlight vendor, Marianne Sylvester, Lou Spina and himself. ESCO will come to the next Council Meeting and provide additional information. Andy Merola from CCM will also attend the meeting since CCM sponsors the Streetlight program and vetted the list of vendors.
- The budget process has started; he will meet with Department Heads to review their budgets in the next few weeks.
- A Solid Waste Consultant has been hired; he will be making a presentation to the Council at a future meeting.
- He is working on a new field use policy for out of town field usage with Sue Schein and Lou Spina and it will be coming to the Council at a future meeting. All funds collected will be put in a fund and used for upkeep of the fields (similar to the Picnic Funds).

. CHIEF OF POLICE'S REPORT

Chief Salvatore reported:

- The Monthly Incident Report for December was distributed.
- The Department received over 13,000 calls for 2014.
- Gave kudos to the Records Division and the Captain for updating the UCR information into the new system. This is a lot of extra work that needs to be done by March so the Town will be able to apply for Federal Grants.
- The Detectives are working on a bank robbery that occurred at Season's Credit Union. There are also some embezzlements cases they are working on.

J. PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Public Works Director Spina reported:

- He is working on his first Cromwell budget.
- F. Thomas retired; three in-house applications for the position were received.
- F. Thomas will be working one day a week for training purposes.
- Cardinal Engineering is reviewing the design for County Line Road and Benesch Engineering is reviewing the design for Willowbrook Road.
- The Christmas tree pick-up will be done by the end of the week.
- He is having an Assessment done on all of the Town's playgrounds next week.

Director of Planning & Development/EDC S. Popper presented the request. The intent of this request is to repurpose the STEAP fund balance of \$300,000 from two previous projects and use it to make improvements to Cromwell Landing Park.

Motion made by R. Newton seconded by A. Waters and *unanimously* carried to approve the Resolution Endorsing Reuse of the STEAP Grant funds and authorize the Town Manager to sign the Grant request.

4. Request from the American Legion to add a memorial to Valor Green. American Legion Post 105 member A. Salvatore presented the request on behalf of the American Legion members that were unable to attend the Town Council Meeting. Chief Salvatore advised the intent was to build a Memorial Stone Wall, additional parking along Prospect Street and walking paths to the Memorial. The Legion would also like to include military hardware in the Memorial. The consensus of the Council was that one piece of hardware may be more appropriate for the Green than 3 pieces.

Motion made by A. Waters seconded by R. Newton and *unanimously carried* to approve concept of adding a memorial to Valor Green.

1. New Businesses & Construction Update:

- The wetlands application for the construction of the new SHS 74,000 square foot office building was approved by the IWWA on Wednesday January 7, 2015.
- The proposed addition to the GKN facility at 1000 Corporate Row was approved by the Zoning Board of Appeals at their meeting on Tuesday January 13, 2015.
- An application for a site plan modification has been submitted to the PZC for the development of a new 11,000 sf. medical office building at 1 Willowbrook Road.
- A new sushi restaurant is proposed for the former Senor Pancho's site in the Cromwell Cross Roads Shopping Center.
- Pet Smart is under construction in the sites of the former Curves and Dollar Stores in the Cromwell Commons Shopping Center.

2. Discover Cromwell 2015 Guide

We continue working with the publisher by supplying data and information and reviewing draft copies of the Discover Cromwell 2015 Guide.

3. Cromwell Downtown Merchants Association

We continue working with the Cromwell Downtown Merchants Association planning for the 3rd Annual Memorial Day Car Show event in May.
