Board of Education Chairman Matrullo was present and reported:

- They closed the last fiscal year with a surplus
- They had a slight uptick in COVID cases. They have been in continuous contact with the Town and State Health Departments.
- 93% of their staff have been vaccinated.
- They have asked students to bring proof of vaccination cards to school so that if they were exposed to a COVID positive student they would not have to quarantine
- School projects are in their planning phases

The Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Committee Chairperson Aigné Goldsby was present and reported:

- The Community Conversation event they held was successful and they had a great turn out. She informed the Council that the next Community Conversation has been pushed out to the Spring to allow for more time for facilitator training.

**E. MAYOR'S UPDATE**

Mayor Faienza reported:

- September 3rd was the Meet and Greet at Covenant Living.
- He received and read a memo from Ann Grasso attached hereto as Attachment A.
- He clarified that the 250 acres on the eastern side of the northern tier in town that has been a popular topic of discussion is not owned by the Town, it is owned by a private venture with a developer. He insisted that residents call the Town Hall to ask questions, attend meetings and get informed.
- October 21st is the ribbon cutting at The Landon.
- Tomorrow, October 14th is the event sponsored by Covenant Living for candidates presenting their platforms.
- He thanked everyone including the Town Council, Town Manager Salvatore, and Town staff. Staff has been amazing and always went above and beyond; We have made it through some difficult times together. He said it has been his honor to serve the community. He concluded by saying the residents are our greatest asset and he thanked them all for making his years the best.

**F. TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT**

Town Manager Salvatore started his report by thanking Mayor Faienza for his years of service and said that it has been an honor and privilege working with him, they have accomplished a lot and he will be greatly missed. He wished Mayor Faienza and his family the best. He also thanked Councilman Ahlquist for his service to the Town of Cromwell.

Town Manager Salvatore reported that the sidewalks on the north end of Main Street are looking great. He commended Jon Harriman and Mike Shewokis on a great job. The retaining wall was removed and they are beginning the process of starting a new wall.

He asked the Town Council for a general consensus on the following:

- Sale of Marijuana in the Town of Cromwell (to prohibit or allow)
- Thoughts on allowing smoking marijuana on public property. He clarified that this will also include the prohibition of smoking cigarettes on public property.

A brief discussion was held and the Council members wanted to get more input from various town departments including the Police Department before deciding.

**G. FINANCIAL/FINANCE DIRECTOR'S UPDATE**

**1. Budget Report**

Finance Director Marianne Sylvester submitted a written report and presented it to the Town Council. In addition, she reported:

- The Town's surplus at the end of the fiscal year was around \$600,000.
- The Board of Finance approved the premium pay for employees. The next step is to sit down with the Town Manager to finalize it and disperse it to the employees.
- The American Rescue Plan Act announced that their final rule should be out by the end of this year.

**H. CHIEF OF POLICE'S UPDATE**

Police Chief LaMontagne wished Mayor Faienza luck and said it has been an honor and privilege to work with him and thanked him on behalf of the Police Department.

Chief LaMontagne submitted a written report and read it to the Town Council. She also informed the Town Council of a COVID grant received which allows officers to work evenings in an attempt to deter youth and others from car thefts and other crimes.

**I. PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR'S UPDATE**

Acting Public Works Director/Town Engineer Jon Harriman was present and reported:

- The Roof Replacement on the Town Hall began. He does not expect it to be completed until May.
- The retaining wall project has started.
- The Community Connectivity Grant sidewalk project was 80% grant funded with a 20% Town obligation.
- Paving was started and is almost complete.
- A new backhoe will be delivered on October 14<sup>th</sup>.

**J. CITIZEN COMMENTS**

**Allan Spotts, 62 Blackhaw Drive** addressed Mayor Faienza and expressed that it has been a privilege serving with him since back in 2013 when the Town Manager/Mayor form of government began. He added that their relationship went back to the Republican Town Committee in 2007. He thanked Mayor Faienza again for everything he has done for Cromwell. Mr. Spotts suggested that the Town

Council consider a 50% reduction in the transfer station pass for seniors. He also suggested the Town consider a 6-month pass instead of a 12-month pass, as many residents do not use the 20 punches that come with the 12-month pass before it expires. Lastly, he mentioned that he supports the petition for sidewalks on West Street.

**Michael Cannata, 136 Nooks Hill Road** addressed the Town Council and commented that the recycling center has been operating greatly under the new management. He added that the communication has been great and the facility is much neater than it has been in the past. He suggested rather than the passes for the transfer station expiring on December 31, they expire when all the punches have been used. He stated that the cost for the pass for the transfer station is a great deal and our price is the lowest around.

**Dan Brisson, 10 Fenwood Drive** thanked the Town Council for their time and effort and thanked Mayor Faienza for his 8 years of service to Cromwell and said that he has done an awesome job. Mr. Brisson expressed his concern with the Town closing the athletic fields continuously. He has two children in town and his son plays sports for the High School. He feels it is disappointing and inconvenient when his son's games get cancelled altogether because of the closure of the fields, especially when he has to bring him to a neighboring town's field to play. He informed the Council that the athletic fields in Cromwell have been closed 10 times in the last 30 days. He stressed the importance of the fields being open especially since our children have been locked up for a year and a half now due to COVID. Sports are their way to build friendships, have discipline, and the kids enjoy and look forward to playing sports. He suggested that the Parks and Recreation Department manage the closures of the fields instead of Maintenance.

**Dan Reiman, 55 Geer Street** expressed his concern with the message some Councilmen and Mayor are sending regarding the project on the 250-acre industrial/business zoned property is a done deal and that there is nothing the residents can do about it.

Mayor Faienza replied to Mr. Dan Reiman and stated that he did not say it was a done deal, he specified that the Planning and Zoning Commission has the authority over this, the Town Council does not. He suggested residents attend the Planning and Zoning meetings and public hearings, state concerns, be heard and the call the Town Hall for information so they are informed with correct information.

## **K. NEW BUSINESS**

### **3. Transfer Station Pass fee increase (discussion and possible action)**

Acting Public Works Director/Town Engineer Jon Harriman was in attendance to present the memo written by Tony Salvatore, Jr. regarding the proposed Transfer Station Pass increase. Mr. Harriman passed out additional information regarding the request. See Attachment B.

After a brief discussion about offering various types of passes at difference prices, the Town Council decided to give this more thought and collect more information before deciding.

**5. Accept Sidewalk Petition**

Mayor Faienza accepted the petition. A copy of the sidewalk petition was provided. See Attachment D. Mayor Faienza agreed that the sidewalk is needed. He informed the residents that we will be looking for grant money and begin a dialogue and process. He suggested getting the Public Works Director, the Chief of Police, Town Engineer and Town Manager together to get the process started. He said this needs to be added into the upcoming budget. Acting Public Works Director/Town Engineer Jon Harriman weighed in on this project and informed the Council of steps that will need to be taken. He will come up with a cost estimate to bring to the Town Council in the near future.

Marie Roberto, 101 West Street thanked the Town Council, and Town Manager Salvatore for the work on the library. She wished Mayor Faienza the best of luck. She feels that grant money would be great for this sidewalk project and that this sidewalk on West Street is needed for Public Safety, Connectivity, Public Health, and for the Children/Youth. The street is busy, the speeds are high and there is a significant amount of commercial traffic on West Street. She thanked the Town Council for considering the project.

Betty Zuraw, 52 Missionary Road read the Sidewalk Petition to the Town Council. Ms. Zuraw read a letter of support and the importance of the installation of the sidewalks on West Street to the Town Council.

Donna, Fox Glen Resident, said she was diagnosed with an illness in 2004. She walks the sidewalks three times a day. She is in favor of the sidewalk project for

the reasons explained previously. She would like to see the sidewalks in to make her or someone else have a happy day.

Paul Watson, 101 West Street said he has lived at Covenant living for 6 months. He is a retired CPA, when he retired 7 years ago he began volunteering for United Way and AARP. He met a local coordinator for the program at the Senior Center. He walked down to the Senior Center on West Street and the sidewalk just ended. He continued by saying that his job is to provide services for seniors and he cannot picture anyone walking down West Street to the Senior Center. No one in a walker/wheelchair should be walking down to Town Hall or the library without sidewalks. He thanked the Town Council for considering the project and for their response.

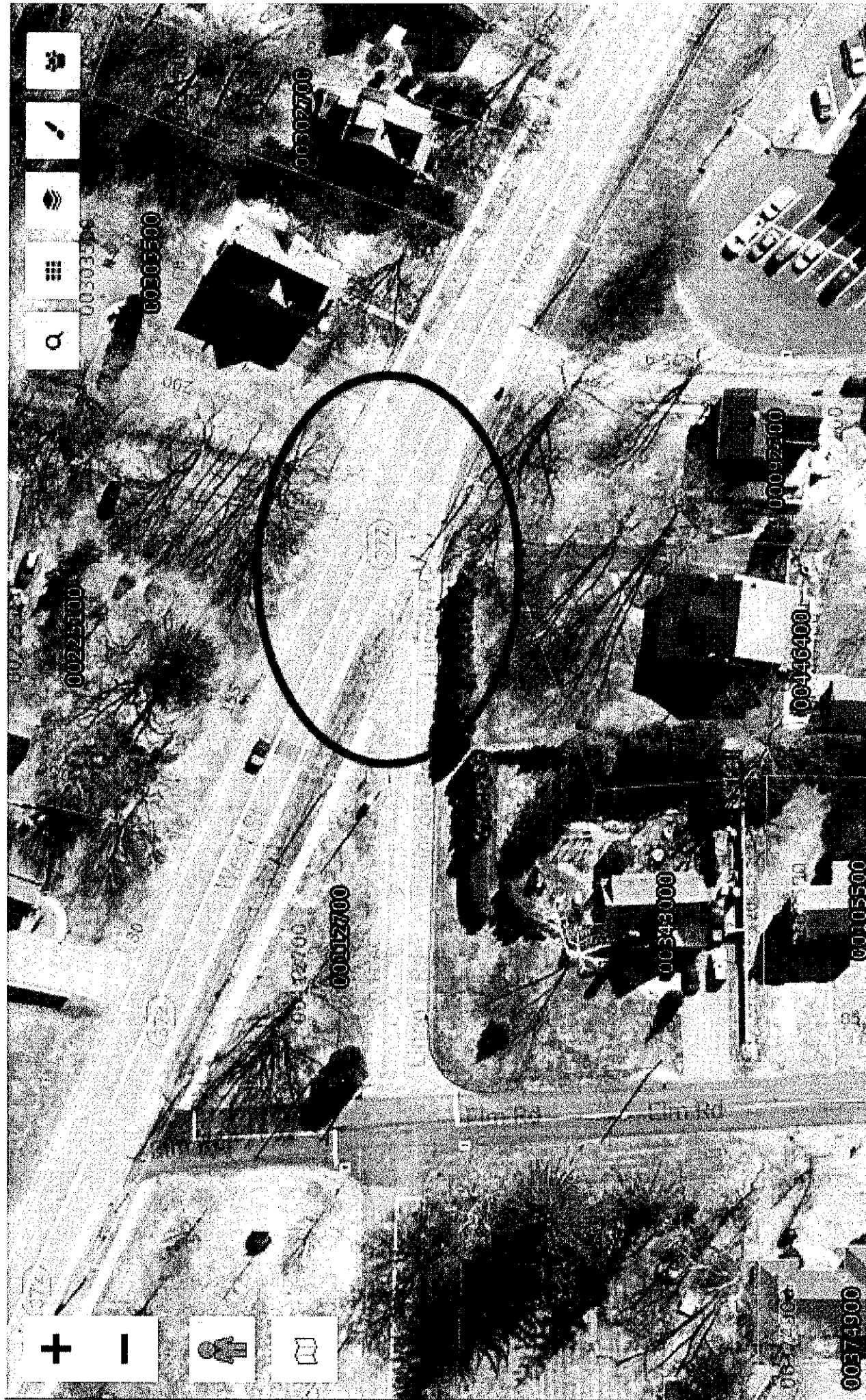
### CONCERNING LACK OF CONTINUOUS SIDEWALKS

2. Shows the north side switch to south side with no crosswalk
3. Shows a crosswalk from north side to south side grass, and requirement to cross Allen Place, with no crosswalk or sidewalk, to get to Town Hall.

We, the undersigned citizens of Cromwell, CT, in the interest of ensuring pedestrian safety along the heavily and often speedily travelled Rt. 372 (West Street), request a continuous sidewalk on the south side of the road. Residents living in the Rt. 372 area need a safer and less hazardous pedestrian environment. A large portion of the road already has sidewalks, but a key part of the walking route adjacent to the Town Hall, Senior Center and Town Library has no sidewalk. Where the existing sidewalk ends at Lincoln St., pedestrians have 2 choices: They can jump the curb and walk on grass along the road, which is not even possible in winter when the grass area is covered with snow plowed from the road, requiring that the pedestrians then walk directly on the highway. The other option is to cross Rt. 372—at a point which additionally has a dangerous curve nearby in the road—to access a strip of sidewalk that exists on the other side of 372. But the pedestrian then has to re-cross the highway a short distance later to get to the side where the Town Hall, Senior Center, and Library are located.

A sidewalk on Allen Rd., to the left of, and leading to, the Town Hall complex, would further ensure the safety of pedestrians, especially children going to the library and elders going to the Senior Center. Safe continuous sidewalk access to the popular Pierson Park is likewise denied pedestrians by the absence of a continuous sidewalk on the south side of 372 down to the park entrance.

In the interest of having the safest and least hazardous pedestrian access to key town facilities such as Town Hall, Senior Center and the Town Library, as well as Pierson Park, the undersigned citizens of Cromwell request that the town government install much needed, safety-ensuring continuous sidewalks on Rt. 372, as outlined above.

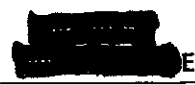
